Have You Read Your Rules & Regulations Lately?

This is a reminder that the Rules and Regulations are in effect and being enforced. All residents and their guests are expected to know and abide by these rules. New Rules and Regulations were voted on and adopted by the Board of Directors on May 27, 2022. You can access the Rules and Regulations by going to our website at Orangeharbormhc.com, click on the documents tab, click on community rules, and click on the pdf file.

The Manufactured Home continued...

4. Manufactured home ties-downs and blocking must comply with all applicable government laws, ordinances, and regulations.

5. All contractors must be licensed and have a valid proof of liability and workman's compensation insurance to conduct work in the community.

6. All manufactured homes within the community must meet, at any time and from time to time, then current community established standards respecting the maintenance of the manufactured home, fire standards, health standards, and all other standards as further imposed respecting the manufacture of manufactured homes by federal and state agencies inclusive of the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

7. No manufactured home shall be removed or brought into the community without the prior approval of management. Any resident intending to remove their manufactured home from the community must give the Co-op thirty (30) day notice in writing prior thereto. The resident shall remain responsible for either the Co-op Fee or rental fee until their manufactured home has either been sold or re-conveyed to the Co-op.

8. Management reserves the right to enter a manufactured home after the resident's prior written consent has been obtained or to prevent imminent danger to an occupant of the manufactured home or the manufactured home, without liability. Such consent may be revoked in writing by the Resident at any time. Management has the right to enter onto the lot for purposes of repair and replacement of utilities and protection of the community at all reasonable times, but not in such manner as to interfere unreasonably with the resident's quiet enjoyment of the lot.

9. No window air conditioners are permitted in front of the manufactured home or facing the street.

IV. MANUFACTURED HOME SITES

1. Manufactured home shall be attractively maintained and comply with all applicable laws, ordinances and regulations of state, county, or community as from time to time amended.

Each manufactured home shall have skirting, a carport, outside storage shed and a concrete driveway. Skirting that has deteriorated to a point where it has fallen off the home must be repaired or replaced. Replacement design is limited to original design or management approved similar design. Replacement material is limited to original material or management approved similar material. Homes must be maintained year-round even when resident is gone.

2. The home and lot must be kept free of debris. The carport must be maintained in a neat and orderly condition. Outside storage shed must be maintained. Storage outside of the manufactured home will be permitted only in approved utility room/storage shed attached under carport roof. Any new outside storage shed must be approved by management prior to construction.

3. The use of foil, corrugated cardboard, paper, or sheets to cover window and glass doors are unsightly and are not permitted. Curtains, window shades or mini blinds are permitted.

4. No resident shall have a citizen's band or ham radio antenna placed on their lot, unless approved by management. Residents are allowed to install and maintain antennas used to receive video programming in accordance with Section 207 of the Telecommunication Act of 1996. This Federal Communications Commission rule allows residents to install video antennas including direct-to-home satellite dishes that are less than one meter in diameter, TV antennas and wireless cable antennas. This rule does not apply to citizen's band or ham radio antenna.

5. Before any digging on the lot for trees, shrubs, large flowering plants, etc., residents must first have written permission from management to avoid damage to underground facilities and for lawn maintenance considerations. No plants or trees can be planted or removed unless written permission is received from management.

6. Lawns will be maintained by the Co-op only to the extent of mowing and edging. The resident is responsible for watering, trimming, weeding, clipping, and fertilizing of the lot and maintenance and/or removal of any tree or shrub located on the lot. The only exception is the large palm trees that line the streets that are owned by the Co-op. Dead sod must be replaced and maintained in good condition. Planter beds should contain mulch or decorative rock. Resident must keep lot free of harmful insects. Lot must be maintained by Resident even when home is for sale or when Resident does not reside in the home. If the lot is not satisfactorily maintained, remedies according to Florida Statutes 719 and Prospectus for Shareholders or to Florida Statutes 723 and Prospectus for tenants will be implemented.

Is That Video Real or Not?

In the contemporary digital era, the proliferation of social media platforms and sophisticated editing technologies

has rendered the task of distinguishing authentic video footage from manipulated content increasingly complex. The widespread availability of video editing software, the advent of deep-fake technology, and the potential for misleading contextual framing all contribute to challenges in evaluating the veracity of videos encountered online.

To ascertain whether a video is genuine, one must first examine the origin of the content. For instance, footage disseminated by established news agencies such as the BBC or Reuters is generally subjected to rigorous editorial standards, thereby offering a degree of assurance regarding authenticity. Conversely, videos shared via anonymous social media accounts or obscure websites often lack such oversight, increasing the risk of encountering manipulated or falsified material.

A thorough evaluation should include the identification of digital anomalies. Subtle signs of alteration may include inconsistent lighting between subjects and background, unnatural or jerky movements indicative of frame-by-frame manipulation, blurred edges that can result from compositing, or audio tracks that are out of sync with the visual imagery. An illustrative example is the use of deep-fake technology to superimpose one individual's face onto another's body, resulting in videos where the subject appears to say or do things they never actually did. In recent years, high-profile deepfakes of public figures have circulated widely, underscoring the necessity of vigilance. Another common scenario involves edited protest videos, where scenes are spliced together to alter the timeline of events, thereby misrepresenting reality.

Employing reverse image and video search tools—such as Google Reverse Image Search or InVID—enables users to trace a particular video back to its original publication. This can reveal whether the content has been previously posted, repurposed from unrelated contexts, or deceptively edited to convey a false narrative. For example, videos of natural disasters or accidents are sometimes recirculated years later, misattributed to new events or locations.


Ultimately, critical thinking remains paramount. Viewers are encouraged to question the motives behind each video and seek corroborating evidence from reputable sources. By combining skepticism with practical verification techniques, individuals can more effectively navigate the complex digital media landscape and reach informed judgments about the authenticity of video content.



A Sweet New Beginning: Fort Myers Beach



For the first time since Hurricane Ian destroyed Times Square, Fort Myers Beach has approved a new permanent building: a three-story ice cream shop with residential space above. Its approval marks a turning point for a community struggling to decide how to rebuild Times Square. This decision comes nearly three years after the storm left the area operating with temporary vendors and stalled plans. The new building, replacing Kilwin's Ice Cream, meets updated codes and modern flood standards, and features a smaller, mixed-use design. Some residents welcome the move, while others worry about changes to density and character. Still, this project signals that rebuilding is possible, if not exactly as before. With permitting and construction still ahead, the project shifts the conversation from if Times Square will return to how, it will take shape. This first step may be modest, but it marks the official beginning of Times Square's redevelopment.





If you or family and friends are planning a winter or spring beach trip, many beaches in Lee County are accessible and fairly restored. Fort Myers Beach,

Sanibel, Bonita/Lovers Key are among the most reliably open.

The public beach parks and access points on Fort Myers Beach, including most of its 29 public access ways are open. The only access that remains closed is Access #17. Some access points now feature mobi-mats or ramps for easier ADA-friendly access. Parking is generally pay-by-hour via mobile payment (no more kiosk tickets). A great way to see Ft Myers Beach is to hop on the Trolley and Tram. Route 410 runs from Bowditch Point Park to Lover's Key State Park. Route 490 runs from the Beach Park & Ride located at 11101 Summerlin Square Dr. to Crescent Beach. For more information visit their website at lee.gov or call 239-533-8726 for assistance.

On Sanibel Island, several beaches are open: Bowman's Beach Park, Gulfside City Park, Tarpon Bay Road Beach, Blind Pass Beach, Lighthouse Beach Park-note: the Gulfside parking is open; some bayside lots remain closed. Parking is via a mobile pay system, not traditional pay-stations. The county-operated Causeway Islands beaches on the Sanibel Causeway are open as well.

In the area around Bonita Beach/Lovers Key State Park: many beaches and beach parks are open, though some remain under repair. Access points use the cashless "mobile pay/ pay-by-plate" parking system.

Another option to consider is San Carlos Bay-Bunche Beach Preserve located at 18201 John Morris Rd. Ft. Myers. This is a natural tidal wetland area 718 acre facility on San Carlos Bay. It is considered "Old Florida" with sandy beaches and mangrove forests. Parking is \$2/hour

Featured Amenities Guide

Welcome to our community! We take pride in offering a variety of amenities to make your visit both relaxing and memorable. Please review the following guide to familiarize yourself with our facilities, their locations, and the rules that help keep them enjoyable for everyone.

Swimming Pool-Enjoy a refreshing swim from sunrise to sunset. All guests aged 14 and under must be accompanied by an adult. For your safety, please do not remove the rope separating the deep and shallow ends of the pool. If you do move it, be sure to replace it—failure to do so may result in a fine.

Library-Our clubhouse library is well-stocked with books, puzzles, and games for all ages. When you're done enjoying them, please return items to their proper place.

Billiards-Test your skills on our new billiards table in the clubhouse. Please follow posted rules to ensure everyone can enjoy the game.

Ice Machine-The ice cube machine is located in the clubhouse. Use the provided scoop, take no more than three scoops at a time, and remember to close the lid after use.

Bocce Ball & Shuffleboard-Bocce ball courts are situated next to the clubhouse parking lot, with equipment readily available nearby. Shuffleboard equipment is in the shed beside the court.

Storage and Boat Slips-We offer 41 storage spaces and 17 boat slips, all rented annually on a first-come, first-served basis. For pricing or availability, contact the office directly.

Clubhouse-Located at the heart of our community, the clubhouse is the venue for many of our social activities. It is also available to rent for special occasions. For reservations, please contact Denise Miller at 603-493-1719.

Garbage Disposal and Plant Cuttings-A dumpster and a trailer for plant cuttings are available 24/7. Please do not dispose of large items in the trash compactor—these must have a paid sticker from the office. Sort your waste into the appropriate containers.

Boat Ramps-We have two boat ramps: one near the office and another next to Gypsy Hall by the RV section. Be mindful not to park trucks or trailers where they may be towed during boat launching.

Ping Pong-The table is located in the clubhouse with all of equipment needed for play.

Horseshoe Pits-Horseshoe courts are located near the pavilion and the pool for your enjoyment.

Fishing Pier & Fish Cleaning Station-The fishing pier, found on the northwest side of the park, is open to all residents. Please follow all fishing regulations and dispose of used fishing lines in the designated bin. There's also a fish cleaning station in the RV park, complete with a cutting surface and running water. Please dispose of fish waste.

Dog Park & Wash Station-A fenced-in dog park is open 24 hours daily for your pets. Dog waste bags and bins are available—remember to clean up after your pet. Wash station located in between the shuffleboard and laundromat.

Pavilions-There are two pavilions—one near the pool and one in the RV section. Both are available to rent for special occasions. To reserve, please contact Denise Miller at 603-493-1719.

Pickleball Court-Located next to the office, the pickleball court operates under rules posted at the entrance. Please note: lights out at 11 p.m.

Laundry Room-Our laundry room is open daily from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. Help us keep it clean by closing the door at all times and reporting any maintenance issues to management immediately. If you discover a problem with a machine, kindly write down the issue and notify the office, as well as place a note on the affected machine.

Restrooms and Showers-There are restrooms and showers located in the clubhouse. They are also available in the RV section. You can find a restroom near the shuffleboard courts and restrooms located in the back of the office with an access door on the outside of the building.

Metal cans-aluminum or steel (tin) cans. No need to remove labels or crush cans.

Cardboard-Any kind of box unless it held a liquid (such as those to hold milk, juice, wine, and broth). Pizza box lids can be recycled, the bottoms can be recycled if they do not have any food residue on them.

Plastic Containers-Look for the number 1-7 within the recycle triangles on the bottom of the container (no Styrofoam, no plastic bags) Lids can be either on or off.




New Orange Harbor Entry & Gate Procedure

There are three entry lanes: right for RV staging (get code, then shift left), center for residents/staff with electronic stickers (automatic gate opens), and left for all other vehicles (use keypad to call resident for entry).

- The new gate system was activated on September 15, 2025. Only registered residents can get stickers; all sublease tenants must be vetted by the office.
- Each gate set includes Lift and Swing Gates. Swing Gates are open 6:00 a.m.–7:00 p.m.; after hours, both gates require keypad or sticker access. Lift Gates open individually for authorized vehicles and all exiting traffic.
- Residents are called from 727-627-0781 at the keypad for gate opening. Surveillance cameras monitor entries/exits.
- Emergency vehicles, Amazon, and U.S. Mail use dedicated entry systems. Vendors and delivery companies may have special codes; other services must use the keypad.
- During emergencies, gates open automatically. Temporary codes for guests/contractors are available from the office and must be managed by residents.
- Residents can buy a second sticker for \$14.00 for a second vehicle. Tailgating is prohibited and enforced by sensors and cameras; violators are liable for damages.

Golf Carts vs Bicycles and Pedestrians



Hey there, road warriors! Just a friendly reminder that golf carts and bikes need to follow the same “rules of the road” as our four-wheeled friends. Golf carts should stick to their side of the street, hit the brakes at all corners, and enter intersections only after giving a good look both ways. 



No bicycles, skateboards, rollerblades, etc. are allowed on courts.



Pet Policies and Procedures



***Reminder- pet owners to observe the park rules regarding dogs, as failure to comply will result in a violation letter!**

- Pick up and dispose of dog waste in YOUR trash or in the dog waste receptacles at the dog park.
- Always keep your dog on a leash and walk them on the road. **8' lead is the maximum allowed.**
- Do not allow your dog to walk, defecate, or urinate in other residents' yards or RV sites.
- Dogs must always be accompanied by an owner, when outside a residence or RV.
- You must keep your dog under control, especially around other dogs and pedestrians.
- Under the noise ordinance, excessive barking is considered a nuisance to other residents, inside or outside a residence.
- ALL PETS must be registered in the office. 8. Please keep cats on leash and do not let them out of your home unsupervised.

Don't forget to send in your dog and/or cat vaccinations to the office.

Wake Zones

The Orange River is an "Idle" zone river all season long. "Idle Speed, No Wake" Zone: A designated area where vessels must be operated at a speed no greater than that which is necessary to maintain steerage and headway. The vessel should not produce a wake at this speed.

The Caloosahatchee River has a "slow wake" from November 15 to March 31. Slow-No Wake means operating a boat at the slowest speed necessary to maintain steerage and reduces or eliminates waves that appear as white water behind the boat in the same location frequently. Resume normal operating speed from April 1-November 14.
