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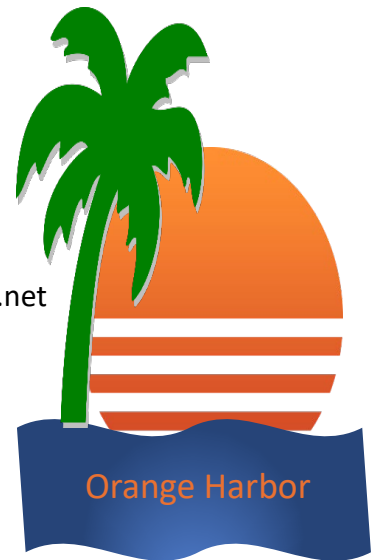

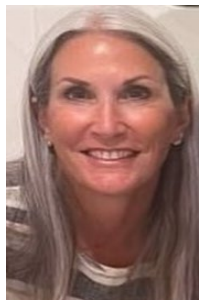

Have You Read Your Rules & Regulations Lately?

This is a reminder that the Rules and Regulations are in effect and being enforced. All residents and their guests are expected to know and abide by these rules. New Rules and Regulations were voted on and adopted by the Board of Directors on May 27, 2022. You can access the Rules and Regulations by going to our website at Orangeharbormhc.com, click on the documents tab, click on community rules, and click on the pdf file.

Approved by the Board of Directors on May 27, 2022
The purpose of these Rules and Regulations is to promote the comfort, welfare and safety of the residents of **ORANGE HARBOR MOBILE HOME AND RV RESORT** and to improve and maintain the appearance and reputation of the Corporation. These Rules and Regulations have been established by the Board of Directors of ORANGE HARBOR CO-OP, INC. (hereinafter called the "Co-op"), the owner of the community, and may be changed by them from time to time to achieve this and other purposes. Notice of changes in these Rules and Regulations shall be given to the residents at least 90 days prior to the date of the implementation of the changes.

III. THE MANUFACTURED HOME

1. Manufactured homes shall be attractively maintained and comply with all applicable laws, ordinances and regulations of state, county, or community as from time to time amended. The resident shall submit to management an application to install a new home indicating all required information. The maximum length and the optimum position on the lot will be determined upon examination of the site by management.
2. All plans for construction or exterior decorating or finishes must first be submitted to management for written approval before proceeding with the construction. No items are to be stored or left sitting outside the home except furniture specifically designed for outdoor use. Detached buildings are not permitted. aluminum products must be new material and must comply with local building codes. No home appurtenances, accessories or add-ons are to look unfinished or homemade.
3. No building, structure, installation, or other improvements shall be placed on any Lot until the plans have been approved by management. Plans may be disapproved solely based on aesthetic standards established at the discretion of the Co-op. All work conducted by either the resident or a licensed contractor must meet current governmental regulations and required permits must be obtained.
4. Manufactured home ties-downs and blocking must comply with all applicable government laws, ordinances, and regulations.

5. All contractors must be licensed and have a valid proof of liability and workman's compensation insurance to conduct work in the community.
6. All manufactured homes within the community must meet, at any time and from time to time, then current community established standards respecting the maintenance of the manufactured home, fire standards, health standards, and all other standards as further imposed respecting the manufacture of manufactured homes by federal and state agencies inclusive of the Department of Housing and Urban Development.
7. No manufactured home shall be removed or brought into the community without the prior approval of management. Any resident intending to remove their manufactured home from the community must give the Co-op thirty (30) day notice in writing prior thereto. The resident shall remain responsible for either the Co-op Fee or rental fee until their manufactured home has either been sold or re-conveyed to the Co-op.
8. Management reserves the right to enter a manufactured home after the resident's prior written consent has been obtained or to prevent imminent danger to an occupant of the manufactured home or the manufactured home, without liability. Such consent may be revoked in writing by the Resident at any time. Management has the right to enter onto the lot for purposes of repair and replacement of utilities and protection of the community at all reasonable times, but not in such manner as to interfere unreasonably with the resident's quiet enjoyment of the lot.
9. No window air conditioners are permitted in front of the manufactured home or facing the street.

IV. MANUFACTURED HOME SITES

1. Manufactured home shall be attractively maintained and comply with all applicable laws, ordinances and regulations of state, county, or community as from time to time amended. Each manufactured home shall have skirting, a carport, outside storage shed and a concrete driveway. Skirting that has deteriorated to a point where it has fallen off the home must be repaired or replaced. Replacement design is limited to original design or management approved similar design. Replacement material is limited to original material or management approved similar material. Homes must be maintained year-round even when resident is gone.
2. The home and lot must be kept free of debris. The carport must be maintained in a neat and orderly condition. Outside storage shed must be maintained. Storage outside of the manufactured home will be permitted only in approved utility room/storage shed attached under carport roof. Any new outside storage shed must be approved by management prior to construction.
3. The use of foil, corrugated cardboard, paper, or sheets to cover window and glass doors are unsightly and are not permitted. Curtains, window shades or mini blinds are permitted.

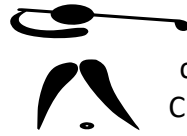
The Lani Kai Island Resort Sundeck is Back, and Better Than Ever

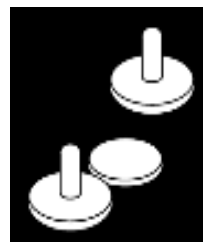

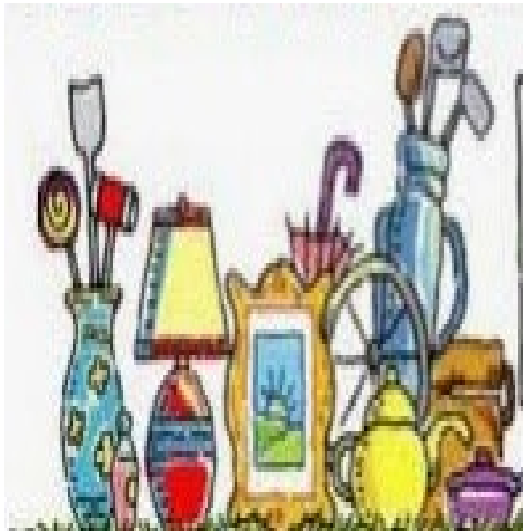

If you or family and friends are planning a winter or spring beach trip, many beaches in Lee County are accessible and fairly restored. Fort Myers

Beach, Sanibel, Bonita/Lovers Key are among the most reliably open.

The public beach parks and access points on Fort Myers Beach, including most of its 29 public access ways are open. The only access that remains closed is Access #17. Some access points now feature mobi-mats or ramps for easier ADA-friendly access. Parking is generally pay-by-hour via mobile payment (no more kiosk tickets). A great way to see Ft Myers Beach is to hop on the Trolley and Tram. Route 410 runs from Bowditch Point Park to Lover's Key State Park. Route 490 runs from the Beach Park & Ride located at 11101 Summerlin Square Dr. to Crescent Beach. For more

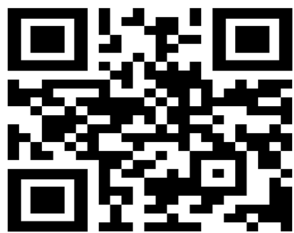

On Sanibel Island, several beaches are open: Bowman's Beach Park, Gulfside City Park, Tarpon Bay Road Beach, Blind Pass Beach, Lighthouse Beach Park-note: the Gulf-side parking is open; some bayside lots remain closed. Parking is via a mobile pay system, not traditional pay-stations. The county-operated Causeway Islands beaches on the Sanibel Causeway are open as well. In the area around Bonita Beach/Lovers Key State Park: many beaches and beach parks are open, though some remain under repair. Access points use the cashless "mobile pay/ pay-by-plate" parking system.

Another option to consider is San Carlos Bay-Bunche Beach Preserve located at 18201 John Morris Rd. Ft. Myers. This is a natural tidal wetland area 718 area facility on San Carlos Bay. It is considered "Old Florida" with sandy beaches and mangrove forests. Parking is \$2/hour

Amenities Use Restriction – Amenities in the community are available to residents and guests who are currently living in Orange Harbor Mobile Home and RV Resort. Homeowners who rent out their property are not permitted to use the community facilities during the period their home is rented. Homeowners may still access their property for necessary purposes but should refrain from using any common areas or amenities while tenants occupy their home.

For added safety, **fire extinguishers** have been installed in the outdoor storage areas to ensure residents and guests have quick access in case of an emergency. Please familiarize yourself with the location of these extinguishers and report any maintenance concerns to management promptly.

We are pleased to announce that four **washing machines** have recently been repaired in the laundromat. If you experience any issues with the machines, please notify the office and be sure to note which specific machine is having a problem and describe the issue as clearly as possible.

Dog lovers, rejoice! The park has rolled out the red carpet for your four-legged friends with a brand-new doggie wash station, conveniently located between the shuffleboard courts and the laundromat. Hot and cold water is available, so your pup can enjoy a spa day worthy of a canine celebrity. **Cat lovers**—if you're feeling brave (or just really need a clean cat), we dare you to try washing your feline. Just remember: we're not responsible for any dramatic escape attempts or soggy furball meltdowns!

If you are having a concern, need attention to a matter, or just need to vent, the best resource is to go to the

office. If you feel the office is not resolving your needs, then approach the board of directors. The office should be your first course of action.

Featured Amenities Guide

Welcome to our community! We take pride in offering a variety of amenities to make your visit both relaxing and memorable. Please review the following guide to familiarize yourself with our facilities, their locations, and the rules that help keep them enjoyable for everyone.

Swimming Pool-Enjoy a refreshing swim from sunrise to sunset. All guests aged 14 and under must be accompanied by an adult. For your safety, please do not remove the rope separating the deep and shallow ends of the pool. If you do move it, be sure to replace it—failure to do so may result in a fine.

Library-Our clubhouse library is well-stocked with books, puzzles, and games for all ages. When you're done enjoying them, please return items to their proper place.

Billiards-Test your skills on our new billiards table in the clubhouse. Please follow posted rules to ensure everyone can enjoy the game.

Ice Machine-The ice cube machine is located in the clubhouse. Use the provided scoop, take no more than three scoops at a time, and remember to close the lid after use.

Bocce Ball & Shuffleboard-Bocce ball courts are situated next to the clubhouse parking lot, with equipment readily available nearby. Shuffleboard equipment is in the shed beside the court.

Storage and Boat Slips-We offer 41 storage spaces and 17 boat slips, all rented annually on a first-come, first-served basis. For pricing or availability, contact the office directly.

Clubhouse-Located at the heart of our community, the clubhouse is the venue for many of our social activities. It is also available to rent for special occasions. For reservations, please contact Denise Miller at 603-493-1719.

Garbage Disposal and Plant Cuttings-A dumpster and a trailer for plant cuttings are available 24/7. Please do not dispose of large items in the trash compactor—these must have a paid sticker from the office. Sort your waste into the appropriate containers.

Boat Ramps-We have two boat ramps: one near the office and another next to Gypsy Hall by the RV section. Be mindful not to park trucks or trailers where they may be towed during boat launching.

Ping Pong-The table is located in the clubhouse with all of equipment needed for play.

Horseshoe Pits-Horseshoe courts are located near the pavilion and the pool for your enjoyment.

Fishing Pier & Fish Cleaning Station-The fishing pier, found on the northwest side of the park, is open to all residents. Please follow all fishing regulations and dispose of used fishing lines in the designated bin. There's also a fish cleaning station in the RV park, complete with a cutting surface and running water. Please dispose of fish waste.

Dog Park & Wash Station-A fenced-in dog park is open 24 hours daily for your pets. Dog waste bags and bins are available—remember to clean up after your pet. Wash station located in between the shuffleboard and laundromat.

Pavilions-There are two pavilions—one near the pool and one in the RV section. Both are available to rent for special occasions. To reserve, please contact Denise Miller at 603-493-1719.

Pickleball Court-Located next to the office, the pickleball court operates under rules posted at the entrance. Please note: lights out at 11 p.m.

Laundry Room-Our laundry room is open daily from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. Help us keep it clean by closing the door at all times and reporting any maintenance issues to management immediately. If you discover a problem with a machine, kindly write down the issue and notify the office, as well as place a note on the affected machine.

Restrooms and Showers-There are restrooms and showers located in the clubhouse. They are also available in the RV section. You can find a restroom near the shuffleboard courts and restrooms located in the back of the office with an access door on the outside of the building.

Cardboard-Any kind of box unless it held a liquid (such as those to hold milk, juice, wine, and broth). Pizza box lids can be recycled, the bottoms can be recycled if they do not have any food residue on them.

Plastic Containers-Look for the number 1-7 within the recycle triangles on the bottom of the container (no Styrofoam, no plastic bags) Lids can be either on or off.

Glass-green, brown, and clear bottles and jars.

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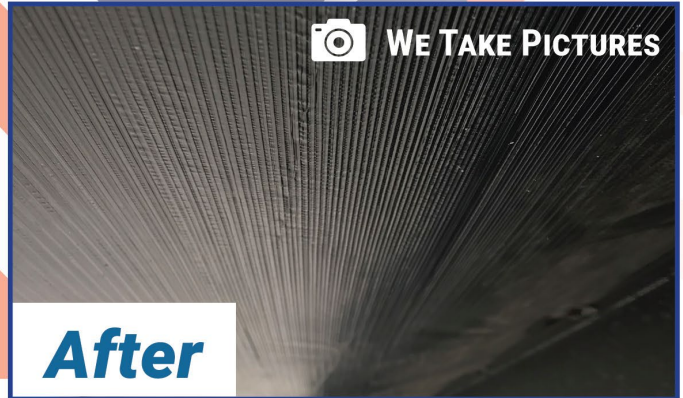
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New Orange Harbor Entry & Gate Procedure

There are three entry lanes: right for RV staging (get code, then shift left), center for residents/staff with electronic stickers (automatic gate opens), and left for all other vehicles (use keypad to call resident for entry).

- The new gate system was activated on September 15, 2025. Only registered residents can get stickers; all sublease tenants must be vetted by the office.
- Each gate set includes Lift and Swing Gates. Swing Gates are open 6:00 a.m.–7:00 p.m.; after hours, both gates require keypad or sticker access. Lift Gates open individually for authorized vehicles and all exiting traffic.
- Residents are called from 727-627-0781 at the keypad for gate opening. Surveillance cameras monitor entries/exits.
- Emergency vehicles, Amazon, and U.S. Mail use dedicated entry systems. Vendors and delivery companies may have special codes; other services must use the keypad.
- During emergencies, gates open automatically. Temporary codes for guests/contractors are available from the office and must be managed by residents.
- Residents can buy a second sticker for \$14.00 for a second vehicle. Tailgating is prohibited and enforced by sensors and cameras; violators are liable for damages.

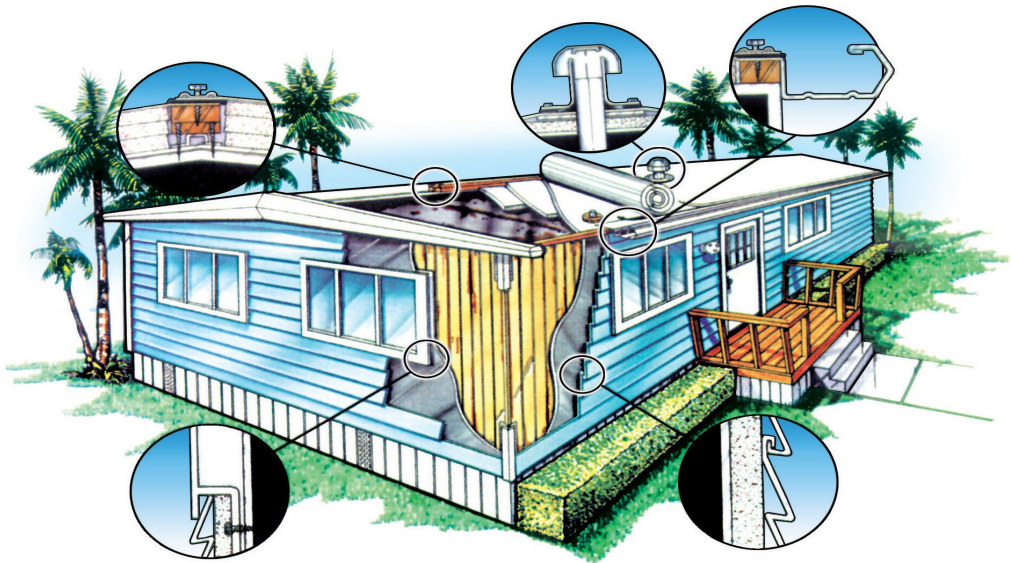


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The Nile Monitor: An Invasive Threat in Southwest Florida

Southwest Florida (SWFL) is celebrated for its lush landscapes, abundant wildlife, and vibrant communities. However, in recent

years, the region has faced a new ecological challenge: the invasion of the Nile monitor lizard. Native to Africa, Nile monitors are large, semi-aquatic reptiles known for their adaptability and voracious appetite. Their arrival and growing population in SWFL have sparked concern among local residents, wildlife officials, and environmental experts.

First spotted in Lee County over a decade ago, these lizards have gradually expanded their territory, favoring canals, lakes, and wetlands that mirror their native habitats. Adult Nile monitors can reach up to seven feet in length, making them one of the largest lizard species found outside their home range. Their diet is remarkably diverse, and includes birds, fish, small mammals, eggs, and dead animals—posing a direct threat to native wildlife and local pets.

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) has documented several negative impacts

associated with the Nile monitor's presence. Not only do they compete with native species for food and habitat, but their burrowing behavior can undermine levees, cause erosion, and threaten infrastructure. Additionally, their aggressive nature and sharp claws make them a potential danger to humans, especially if approached or cornered.

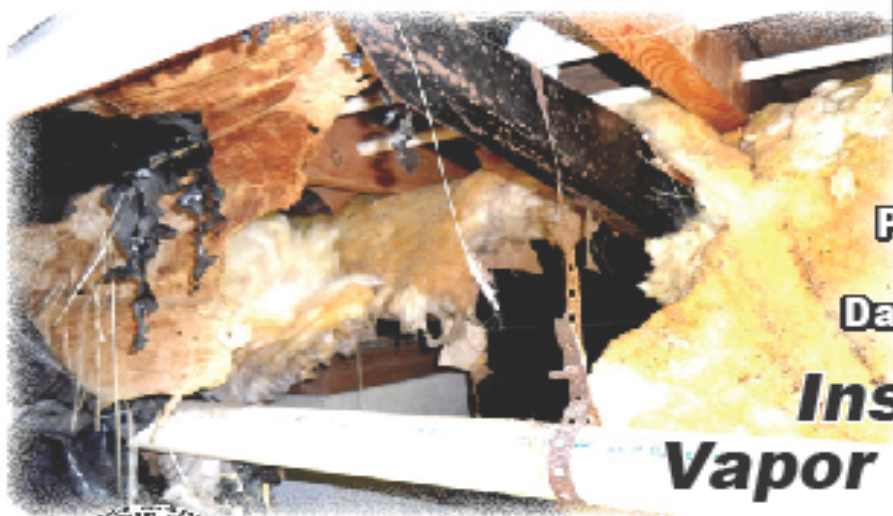
- Efforts to control and eradicate the Nile monitor population are ongoing. The FWC encourages residents to report sightings and avoid interacting with these animals. If you see a Nile monitor, you can report it at IveGot1.org, by calling the 888-IveGot1 (483-4681) hotline, or using the free IveGot1smartphone app with the following information:
- A high-resolution, focused photograph on the animal
- The location where the animal was seen (GPS coordinates preferred)
- The date the animal was observed

Nile monitors are not venomous. However, their bite can transmit the dangerous bacteria present in their mouth, which can lead to serious infection.

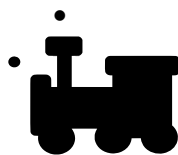
If you are interested in being the caller or validator sign-ups will be in the clubhouse.

Membership is open to all residents of the park. You don't need to own a boat, just have an interest in being involved in our community and support our outreach efforts.



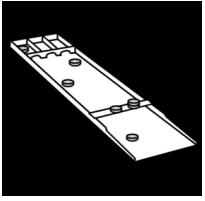

No bicycles, skateboards, rollerblades, etc. are allowed on courts.

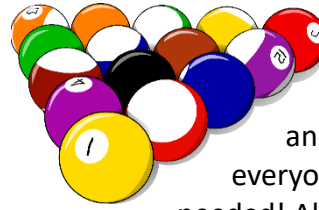

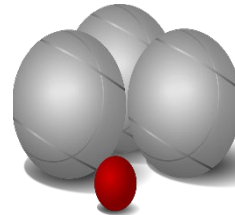

Our next crushed glass project in the white frames will be on Tuesday, Jan. 13. However, you will need to register and pay in advance, as there is extensive preparation for this project. We need to order the frames, seal them, and allow them to dry in advance. You will need to be signed up and paid for this project by Jan. 6. The cost for the 5x7 frame project is \$15. The cost for 8x10 is \$20. The signup sheet is in the clubhouse. If you want to participate on Jan. 13 and are not in the park by Jan. 6, have someone who is here sign you up and pay for you. The sooner you sign up, the sooner we can order the frames. I will close the class if I get 20 participants.

On Tues. On Jan. 6, I will bring my samples for both crushed glass projects: those where we make our design inside the white frames and those where we design on canvas. For those of you attending the Jan. 13 class (crushed glass in white frames), you will need to select your pattern on Jan. 6 or review my samples to design your own. This is not a hands-on project day. It is just a day to learn all the details about the two projects, so you are prepared to work on them on the day of the activity.

We will do the crushed glass on canvas project on Tues. Feb. 3. That should give you enough time to find your own canvas print. If you are doing a small canvas, it shouldn't be any larger than 5X7. A larger canvas shouldn't exceed 12x12 or 11x13.

For the crushed glass projects, we provide the crushed glass and liquid glass. We also have broken glass, sea glass, seashells, gems, beads, sand, glitter, glass gems, etc., to choose from.

9:15 – If you have heard about this program

but are not sure what it entails, please attend this meeting. I have been trained as a leader and have been doing this program for about a dozen years now at Orange Harbor. If you have been in the program before and would like to share how it has helped you, you are welcome to join us.

- Dr. Miriam Nelson, from Tufts University in Boston, conducted a study on the benefits of strength training. Compared with people in the sedentary group, people in the exercise group showed increased strength, muscle mass, bone density, and balance.
- As a result of this study, Dr. Nelson developed a structured strength-training program for midlife and older adults. This training increases muscle mass, strength, and balance; bone density; arthritis symptoms; metabolic rate; and glucose control and lipid profile.
- One exercise in particular, therapists recommend you do for the rest of your life. You will also learn balance exercises you can do every day.

Wed. Jan. 7 – First session doing the actual exercises.

Class starts at 9:15. The Power Walking class is done by 9, so come early to pick out a set of weights, which are provided. We begin with one lb. weights and go up from there. You don't have to use weights if you don't want to. You can also bring your own. Find your spot in the clubhouse and then take a few minutes to socialize before class. Some folks have been coming to my class since the very beginning. Bring water to drink and wear tennis shoes – no sandals. I will go through one set of each exercise today. Next week, we will do two sets of each exercise. I try to be done by 10 am or shortly after, so those who want to do water aerobics can do so.

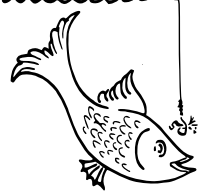

Pet Policies and Procedures

Wake Zones

The Orange River is an "Idle" zone river all season long. "Idle Speed, No Wake" Zone: A designated area where vessels must be operated at a speed no greater than that which is necessary to maintain steerage and headway. The vessel should not produce a wake at this speed.

The Caloosahatchee River has a "slow wake" from November 15 to March 31. Slow-No Wake means operating a boat at the slowest speed necessary to maintain steerage and reduces or eliminates waves that appear as white water behind the boat in the same location frequently. Resume normal operating speed from April 1-November 14.
