#### **COMMUNITY MANAGER NEWS**

As we reach the end of another season, I want to thank the residents and visitors for a great season. Our RV park was full all season thanks to the hard work of Sarah plugging in the holes in the reservations system. She obtained a 99.9% occupancy rate. I commend the residents on the improvements to their homes. The park has never looked so good!

We are improving on following the rules. However, we still have some problems with pets. The latest are cats running loose getting into trash and making a mess. It is very dangerous letting your cat outside as there are predators that go after them. We are also getting complaints about dogs barking. If your dog is a barker, I recommend you purchase a "bark collar". I have used them and it usually only takes a day or two for the dog to learn.

On the real estate side, we will have a sheriff's sale (auction) on 148 Orange Harbor Drive. Look for the e-mail or the sign. All bidders must be prequalified to bid. Anyone who is not a current owner, shareholder, or annual RV resident, is required to have a background/credit check before bidding.

I would like to remind all "for sale by owner" buyers and sellers that they must file forms with the office prior to sale. This includes background/credit checks, and estoppel (review of account) so you know what is owed. When you buy a home, you also buy the affiliated debt. This requirement is for everyone's protection! If this rule is not followed, and you buy a home you may have to move it out of the park or give it to the Co-Op.

We have some good news on the permits we have been waiting for. We have received the permit to takeout 3 Shoreland and the permit to set 69 shoreland. We are still waiting for permits for the entrance and the pickleball courts.

As I write the article, we are doing a Survey Monkey on the fiber optic project. Early results favor the desire to install the fiber optic system that will bring OH into the speed of light communications era.

- 6. Under the noise ordinance, excessive barking is considered a nuisance to other residents; inside or outside a residence.

#### Orange Harbor Closing-up Checklist

#### Things to do before leaving for the summer . . .

- 1. Make outside mower friendly, and spray for weeds before leaving.
- 2. Have a local summer caregiver and give the name/number of the person to office.
- 3. Spray for ants before leaving.
- 4. Put away ALL outside lawn furniture, hoses, barbeque grills, statues, fountains, etc.
- 5. Un-Plug all electrical appliances and computers.
- 6. Make sure RV sheds are hurricane tied-down and security locked.
- 7. Discard all perishable food items.
- 8. Make sure all smoke alarms are working and have fresh batteries.
- 9. Tum refrigerator and freezer off. Prop doors open.
- 10. Put plastic wrap over toilet and tank to prevent water from evaporating.
- 11. If you leave air on, set thermostat at 80-90 degrees (set it on cool and auto).
- 12. Put fresh batteries in thermostats.
- 13. If you have a humistat, set to 65.
- 14. Clean or replace your air conditioner filter.
- 15. Tum water OFF
- 16. Tum off hot water heaters.
- 17. Close and lock windows and doors before you leave.
- 18. Forward your mail and put a note in your mail box. RVer's tie your mail box closed.
- 19. Make sure office has your correct address, phone#, email, and a set of keys.
- 20. Put Phone and cable "on vacation".
- 21. Return all books, puzzles, videos and DVDs to Community Library.
- 22. Call the Electric Company and give them your summer address.
- 23. Put all awnings down and secure.
- 24. The Orange Harbor website has a community channel for major news events and severe storm conditions. We will list major community damages and a general status of homes.



#### ON YOUR COMPUTER, PHONE AND/OR TABLET:

- 1. First, if you do not have google calendar on your phone, computer and/or tablet, you must download it (free)
- 2. Email me, (Jeannie Miller) jem1931823@gmail.com the email you used for the google calendar app.
- 3. If you have a 'gmail.com' email, you will be accepted right when I accept your email. If you do not have gmail, then you will receive an email invitation to receive OH events calendar. It will ask you to Click on link and it will download to your calendar.
- 4. Once I have received your emails and accepted them, you can open google calendar, if OH events are not on your calendar, click on 3 lines on left top. Scroll down until you see the email address you sent, click boxes that say OH Activity and Events. If you do not see it there, click three lines and go to settings, there you will see 'oh activities and events' make sure box is checked!
- 5. Done!

#### KAYAKING THE ESTERO RIVER

ESTERO OUTFITTERS 20991 S.Tamiami Trail Estero, FL 239-992-4050

**Overview:** Going east the river is narrow with no power boats. Winding under trees in shallow water is very quiet and peaceful.

Add on to this 2-hour trip or plan another trip by going west. The river starts as a curving black water stream through hardwood hammocks, the lush shoreline eventually gives way to mangrove swamps, coastal bays and islands. Yellow-crowned night herons, cormorants and anhingas are easily spotted; black-whiskered vireos and mangrove cuckoos are rarer. Two prominent historic sites are featured along the trail: the Koreshan Community and Mound Key. The trail also circumnavigates the island of Lover's Key State Park.

Cost for 2 hours, single and double: Kayaks under 13 ft. \$17.50 per person, over 13 ft. \$22.50 per person (plus tax on all) No cost if you bring your own. Just bring water, suntan lotion, camera, etc. **Driver's License is needed at the time of the rental.**



#### **COVID-19 Guidance**

#### **Orange Harbor Clubhouse & and Common Area Usage**

It is crucial to minimize the risks of spreading the coronavirus. This guidance is in compliance with CDC guidelines and is designed to maintain health and safety standards requirements and physical distancing directives while providing opportunity for our residents to attend functions and participate in activities throughout the park.

Use of Orange Harbor facilities and participation in activities is At Your Own Risk.

Maintain at least 6 feet of separation as much as possible in areas that may lead to close contact with other people. Areas include: the clubhouse, both pavilions, laundromat, other gathering spaces, and outdoor activities.

The CDC recommends that you do not shake hands, give high-fives, do elbow bumps, or touch others. Close contact increases the risk of getting the COVID-19 virus.

When attending an activity either inside or outside of the clubhouse, maintain as much distance as possible between yourself and other individuals, and use masks if they do not interfere with your activity.

**Follow proper prevention hygiene.** Wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after you have been in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing.

Use alcohol-based (at least 60% alcohol) hand sanitizer when soap and water is not available. Hand sanitizer is available in the common indoor areas, ie: clubhouse, office and laundromat.

Residents with underlying medical conditions should be extra vigilant in adherence to these quidelines.

#### Clubhouse - Gatherings, Social Events & Activities

The OH community cleaning crew sanitizes the clubhouse daily.

- Use large round tables with only 6 chairs per table. This will represent the maximum number of people allowed in the clubhouse for events and activities.
- Social distancing should always be encouraged.
- There will be no potluck dinners. Food prepared in your home should not be brought into the clubhouse for the purpose of sharing with others.
- Sanitize tables and other surfaces before and after use.
- Sanitize equipment before and after use (ie: card tables microphones, pool cues, tables, etc)
- Food prep in the kitchen: preparers and servers should wear gloves and masks.
   Kitchen should be sanitized before and after use.



#### Monitor your health daily.

Watch for fever, cough, shortness of breath or other symptoms of Covid-19. If you have any of these symptoms or in general feel un-well, do not use any of the Orange Harbor facilities or anticipate in any OH events or activities; stay home and contact your physician.
