Have You Read Your Rules & Regulations Lately?

This is a reminder that the Rules and Regulations are in effect and being enforced. All residents and their guests are expected to know and abide by these rules. New Rules and Regulations were voted on and adopted by the Board of Directors on May 27, 2022. You can access the Rules and Regulations by going to our website at Orangeharbormhc.com, click on the documents tab, click on community rules, and click on the pdf file.

13. PROCEDURES FOR SOLVING ANIMAL/PET PROBLEMS a. The following applies to all categories of animals.

b. Attempt to arrive at a solution to the problem with an animal/pet owner in a courteous manner.

c. If personal attempts at a solution fail, then file a detailed, written and signed complaint with the community manager. The complaint is confidential. Include a brief description of attempts to solve the problem.

d. The community manager will first attempt to obtain as an informal solution to the problem. If a solution is not possible, the problem will be referred to the Board of Directors who will ultimately direct the Co- Op's counsel to send a certified letter demanding that the animal be permanently removed from the property within ten (10) days.

e. Suspected stray animals/pets should be reported to the community office.

f. All bites or attacks by any animal/pets shall be immediately reported to Lee County Animal Control (239)533-7387. A written and signed notice of the incident should be given to the community manager, as well as a phone call.

g. In the event of emergency only, the parties involved may take actions deemed prudent to resolve the emergency without regard to the above procedures. Both parties shall file a detailed, written and signed report with the community manager. Reports are confidential.

h. Penalties for violation of applicable Lee County ordinances may be enforced by the county without regard to any remedies pursued by the Co-Op.

14. OTHER a. The Rules and Regulations are subject to change by the Co-Op Board of Directors.

b. Residents shall not feed or shelter wild (feral) animals that seasonally migrate throughout the community. This includes

foxes, rabbits, raccoons, pelicans, seagulls and other wild birds. Most importantly do not feed alligators and manatees. Florida law prohibits feeding alligators and crocodiles. Manatees are protected under the Federal Marine Mammal Protection Act of 1972 and by the Florida Manatee Sanctuary Act of 1978. Never disturb, feed, grab, ride or poke a manatee.

VEHICLES, WATERCRAFT AND PARKING

1. Motor vehicles or golf carts of guests will be parked in the carport or in the driveway. No more than two licensed vehicles are permitted in each driveway. Home sites with a double driveway are permitted no more than four vehicles in the driveway. Golf carts can also be parked on golf cart pads or other areas approved by management.

2. The posted speed limit (15MPH) and traffic signs shall be observed and obeyed always.

3. If one or more written complaints regarding noisy vehicles are received by management, said vehicle may be subject to immediate removal or repair by owner.

4. No vehicles shall be parked in the street overnight. No vehicles shall be parked on grass or empty lots.

5. All vehicles parked in the community must have current registration and plates. No inoperable vehicles are allowed in the community. All residents must adhere to all Florida Department of Motor Vehicle laws within the community.

6. All vehicles parked in the community must have an Orange Harbor sticker on the front window. Guest or renter vehicles staying more than 48 hours must register with the office to obtain a visitor pass. Annual renters must also have a sticker on windshield of vehicle.

7. Overflow parking for guests with permit is limited to the east side of the bocce court parking area and west side of the boat storage parking area. Additional overflow parking is available at the clubhouse, management office and boat ramps, however, overflow and parking at the management office is for after office hours only, 6:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m. Overnight parking at the boat ramps is not permitted without prior management approval.

8. Except for loading, unloading, or charging batteries for a period of NO more than 48 hours, recreational vehicles, trailer, commercial vehicles, and boats shall be parked in the RV section or the storage area only. Residents must register with the office and receive written permission from management before parking in the designated area as there is a rental fee charge. No person is allowed to live in a stored recreational vehicle parked in the community.

It is important to secure a parking permit by visiting the office beforehand. Adhering to this procedure helps maintain order and prevents inconveniences such as vehicles blocking driveways, occupying streets, or using vacant lots unauthorizedly

Featured Amenities Guide

Welcome to our community! We take pride in offering a variety of amenities to make your visit both relaxing and memorable. Please review the following guide to familiarize yourself with our facilities, their locations, and the rules that help keep them enjoyable for everyone.

Swimming Pool-Enjoy a refreshing swim from sunrise to sunset. All guests aged 14 and under must be accompanied by an adult. For your safety, please do not remove the rope separating the deep and shallow ends of the pool. If you do move it, be sure to replace it—failure to do so may result in a fine.

Library-Our clubhouse library is well-stocked with books, puzzles, and games for all ages. When you're done enjoying them, please return items to their proper place.

Billiards-Test your skills on our new billiards table in the clubhouse. Please follow posted rules to ensure everyone can enjoy the game.

Ice Machine-The ice cube machine is located in the clubhouse. Use the provided scoop, take no more than three scoops at a time, and remember to close the lid after use.

Bocce Ball & Shuffleboard-Bocce ball courts are situated next to the clubhouse parking lot, with equipment readily available nearby. Shuffleboard equipment is in the shed beside the court.

Storage and Boat Slips-We offer 41 storage spaces and 17 boat slips, all rented annually on a first-come, first-served basis. For pricing or availability, contact the office directly.

Clubhouse-Located at the heart of our community, the clubhouse is the venue for many of our social activities. It is also available to rent for special occasions. For reservations, please contact Denise Miller at 603-493-1719.

Garbage Disposal and Plant Cuttings-A dumpster and a trailer for plant cuttings are available 24/7. Please do not dispose of large items in the trash compactor—these must have a paid sticker from the office. Sort your waste into the appropriate containers.

Boat Ramps-We have two boat ramps: one near the office and another next to Gypsy Hall by the RV section. Be mindful not to park trucks or trailers where they may be towed during boat launching.

Ping Pong-The table is located in the clubhouse with all of equipment needed for play.

Horseshoe Pits-Horseshoe courts are located near the pavilion and the pool for your enjoyment.

Fishing Pier & Fish Cleaning Station-The fishing pier, found on the northwest side of the park, is open to all residents. Please follow all fishing regulations and dispose of used fishing lines in the designated bin. There's also a fish cleaning station in the RV park, complete with a cutting surface and running water. Please dispose of fish waste.

Dog Park & Wash Station-A fenced-in dog park is open 24 hours daily for your pets. Dog waste bags and bins are available—remember to clean up after your pet. Wash station located in between the shuffleboard and laundromat.

Pavilions-There are two pavilions—one near the pool and one in the RV section. Both are available to rent for special occasions. To reserve, please contact Denise Miller at 603-493-1719.

Pickleball Court-Located next to the office, the pickleball court operates under rules posted at the entrance. Please note: lights out at 11 p.m.

Laundry Room-Our laundry room is open daily from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. Help us keep it clean by closing the door at all times and reporting any maintenance issues to management immediately. If you discover a problem with a machine, kindly write down the issue and notify the office, as well as place a note on the affected machine.

Restrooms and Showers-There are restrooms and showers located in the clubhouse. They are also available in the RV section. You can find a restroom near the shuffleboard courts and restrooms located in the back of the office with an access door on the outside of the building.

Memorial Garden—All are welcome to enjoy the beauty and tranquility of our memorial butterfly garden, thoughtfully designed as a peaceful refuge for quiet reflection. Whether you seek a serene moment alone or wish to admire the fluttering visitors among the blooms, this garden provides a gentle space amid the vibrancy of our community.

Community Vegetable Garden—For residents wishing to cultivate their own fresh produce, the community vegetable garden is open to all paid participants. Plots may be reserved through the garden club on a seasonal basis.

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10 Things You Should Never Put Down the Drain:

To avoid costly plumbing repairs and environmental damage, never pour fats, grease, coffee grounds,

medication, paint, harsh chemicals, produce stickers, fibrous vegetables, starchy foods (rice/pasta), eggshells, or hygiene products (wipes/floss) down the drain. These items cause severe blockages, pipe corrosion, or pollute water systems.

Quick checklist of items to not put down your drain:

1. **Fats, Oils, and Grease (FOG):** Bacon fat, cooking oil, and butter solidify inside pipes, causing major blockages.
2. **Coffee Grounds:** They do not dissolve and accumulate, creating stubborn clogs.
3. **Eggshells:** The sharp, granular pieces stick to grease, forming sludges that blocks pipes.
4. **Starchy Foods (Rice, Pasta, Flour):** These expand with water and turn into a paste, restricting water flow.
5. **Produce Stickers:** These small stickers rarely disintegrate, often getting stuck in pipe walls or caught in filters.
6. **Fibrous Vegetables/Food Scraps:** Celery, corn husks, and potato peels can tangle around disposal blades.
7. **Medications:** Pills and liquids pass through treatment plants into water sources, harming the environment.
8. **Paint and Solvents:** Hazardous chemicals can corrode pipes and damage plumbing.
9. **Flushable/Baby Wipes:** Despite the name, they do not dissolve, creating massive sewer blockages.
10. **Hair and Dental Floss:** These items do not degrade, catching other debris to create large, tangled clogs.

We Recycle on Fridays

Please place your handle towards your house and the open side toward the street for proper pickup!



Recycle Smart-5 For the Cart:

Paper-junk mail, newsprint, magazines, copy paper, phone books, etc. **DO NOT** put in used paper towels, tissues, napkins.

Metal cans-aluminum or steel (tin) cans. No need to remove labels or crush cans.

Cardboard-Any kind of box unless it held a liquid (such as those to hold milk, juice, wine, and broth). Pizza box lids can be recycled, the bottoms can be recycled if they do not have any food residue on them.

Plastic Containers-Look for the number 1-7 within the recycle triangles on the bottom of the container (no Styrofoam, no plastic bags) Lids can be either on or off.

Glass-green, brown, and clear bottles and jars.

Trash Removal and Yard Waste Schedule:

Are you prepared for brush pick-up? **Wednesday** is your day to embrace your inner gardener and tie up those yard clippings into tidy bundles—**each no longer than 3 feet**. Let's keep those sprawling shrub beasts at bay! **A quick tip: keep your green piles away from the mailbox to avoid any accidental tractor showdowns.** Together, we can keep our streets neat and our tractors happy!

Tuesdays & Fridays: Garbage pick-up! Rise and shine, it's garbage time! Get those bags out early to keep the critters away. Remember, no animal buffets!



Maintenance Crew News

We kick off our days at Orange Harbor with the goal of being the absolute best! Let's work together to keep our community clean and efficient by following these guidelines:

1. ****Dog Owners**:** Remember to pick up after your furry friends and dispose of their messes properly—even in the dog park area. Let's keep our spaces enjoyable for everyone!
 2. ****Yard Waste**:** Trim it, cut it, bundle it! Yard trimmings, weeds, and other green waste should be bundled in 3-foot sections and bagged appropriately.
 3. ****Sticker System**:** Everything placed in K-Mart or scheduled for pick-up must have a sticker. These stickers help offset the costs of hauling to the scrap yard or managing the extra compactor weight. You can grab stickers from the office!
 4. ****Manageable Garbage**:** If you can't lift it, neither can we! Use multiple bags for your garbage instead of overstuffing one. Let's make handling trash a breeze!
 5. ****No Maggots Policy**:** A clean trash bin is a happy trash bin! Please ensure your bins are clean and free from pests.

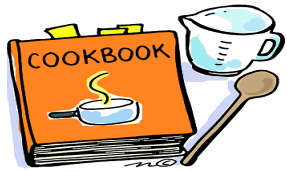

Recipe from the Kitchen of Joe Collier Sausage, Kale, Apples and Onions

Ingredients:

- 2 ounces olive oil
- 4 Italian sausages
- ½ cup onion, diced
- 1 large apple, peeled, cored, sectioned into 8 pieces
- 1 cup kale, medium packed, veins removed, cut into 1 inch pieces
- 1 bulb fennel sliced thin (french style)
- 4 tablespoons water
- 4 tablespoons white wine
- 2 tablespoons butter

Instructions:

Pour olive oil then place sausages into a large saute pan, cook sausages on medium heat for approx. four minutes. Turn sausages over, pierce with a fork then cook for another four minutes, add onion, cook for two minutes, add kale, stirring, cook two minutes. Add sliced fennel cook for additional three minutes, add apple, water and wine, simmer for three minutes while stirring. Remove from heat, stir in butter just before serving. Enjoy!

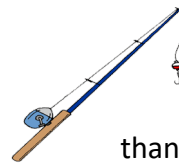

Resources for Hurricane Prep

Living in Florida has its advantages but severe weather is not among those. Residents quickly learn to be prepared for severe weather, from winter freezes, to tornadoes, to hurricanes. As hurricane season begins June 1, it is an opportune time to make advance preparations.

Special Needs

Do you or anyone in your family have special needs or accommodation, such as a physical disability, medical needs, etc.? Now is the time to plan for care during a storm. Register with the Florida Special Needs Registry (flhealthresponse.com) to receive important information from local emergency management officials about evacuation and sheltering options available. This registry allows local personnel to plan should you need electricity to operate medical equipment, transportation to evacuate, or help in accessing medication.

Create a plan for yourself or your family member(s) with special needs now. Having a plan in place will make an emergency less stressful and allow everyone to better respond to the situation. Visit Make a Plan/Florida Disaster (floridadisaster.org) to assess the needs and considerations in creating a plan for preparedness.

Stay Informed

Accessing detailed information about community hazards and knowing what resources are available to you is crucial during a severe weather event. This information will be provided by your local emergency management agency. Also, make sure you sign up for emergency weather alerts in your area. A subscription could save your life!

Florida Public Radio Network stations broadcast public safety and emergency messaging as needed throughout the state as partner stations report on local emergencies. Visit Florida Public Radio Emergency Network (FPREN) floridastorms.org to download their app to your phone or get updates on your computer. For real-time public safety alerts and advisories for the entire state, download, the Futuri Alerts app to your phone.

If you need to evacuate or travel during an emergency, you'll need to know what roadways are safe and free of hazards. Florida Highway Patrol (flhsmv.gov) allows you to view live traffic crash and roadway condition reports.



5 Ways to Lower Your Medical Bills

Medical bills can feel overwhelming, but patients often have more power to lower costs than they realize.

One of the smartest moves is to ask about preventive care. Many insurance plans cover annual checkups, screenings, and vaccines at no cost. Before scheduling an appointment, ask whether the exam or vaccine is fully covered so you can avoid surprise bills.

Prescription drugs are another major expense, but prices vary widely. Compare pharmacies, ask for generic alternatives, and look for discount programs or coupons. Even a simple question — “Is there a cheaper option that works just as well?” — can save hundreds of dollars a year.

For routine scans like MRIs, CT scans, or X-rays, avoid hospitals when possible. Independent imaging clinics often charge far less for the exact same test. Patients who shop around before booking a scan can sometimes cut costs dramatically.

It also pays to stay curious about treatment recommendations. Patients should feel comfortable asking questions such as: Why do I need this? What happens if I wait or don't do it? Are there side effects? Is there a lower-cost alternative? These conversations can prevent unnecessary procedures and help people make informed decisions about their care.

Finally, people struggling with bills or insurance denials do not have to fight alone. Organizations like the Patient Advocate Foundation offer free help with medical debt, billing disputes, and denied claims. Sometimes the best way to slash medical costs is simply to ask questions and seek support.

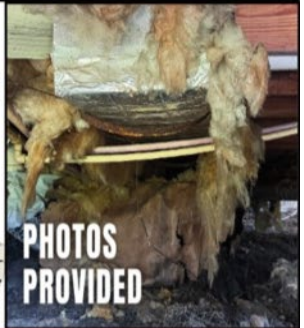


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Golf Carts vs Bicycles and Pedestrians

Orange Harbor Closing-up Checklist

Things to do before leaving for the summer.

1. Make the outside mower friendly and spray weeds before leaving.
2. Have a local summer caregiver and give the name/number of the person to the office.
3. Spray for ants before leaving.
4. Put away ALL outside lawn furniture, hoses, barbeque grills, statues, fountains, etc.
5. Un-Plug all electrical appliances and computers.
6. Make sure RV sheds are hurricane tied down and security locked.
7. Discard all perishable food items.
8. Make sure all smoke alarms are working and have fresh batteries.
9. Turn refrigerator and freezer off. Prop doors open.
10. Put plastic wrap over the toilet and tank to prevent water from evaporating.
11. If you leave the air on, set thermostat at 80-90 degrees (set it to cool and auto).
12. Put fresh batteries in thermostats.
13. If you have a humidistat, set to 65.
14. Clean or replace your air conditioner filter.
15. Turn water OFF 16. Turn off hot water heaters.
17. Close and lock windows and doors before you leave.
18. Forward your mail and put a note in your mailbox.
19. Make sure the office has your correct **address, phone, email**, and a set of keys.
20. Put Phone and cable "on vacation".
21. Return all books, puzzles, videos, and DVDs to Community Library.
22. Call the Electric Company and give them your summer address.
23. Put all awnings down and secure.

Hurricane Preparedness List



Preparing for a hurricane can make a significant difference in ensuring safety and reducing injury and damage. This comprehensive hurricane preparedness list will help you stay organized and ready.

Emergency Kit

- Water: At least one gallon of water per person per day for at least three days
- Food: A three-day supply of non-perishable food
- Battery-powered or hand-crank radio: With NOAA Weather Radio and extra batteries
- Flashlight: And extra batteries
- First aid kit: Including necessary medications
- Whistle: To signal for help
- Dust mask: To help filter contaminated air
- Plastic sheeting and duct tape: To shelter in place
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags, and plastic ties: For personal sanitation
- Wrench or pliers: To turn off utilities
- Manual can opener: For food
- Local maps: In case of evacuation
- Cell phone with chargers: And backup batteries
- Important documents: Insurance policies, identification, and bank records

Personal Items

- Prescription medications and glasses
- Infant formula, bottles, diapers, and wipes
- Pet food and extra water for your pet
- Cash or traveler's checks and change
- Books, games, puzzles, or other activities for children

Before a Hurricane

- Know your evacuation routes
- Secure your home: Cover windows, secure outdoor objects, and reinforce doors
- Fill your car with gas and check your vehicle's readiness
- Review of your insurance policies
- Take photos or video of your belongings for insurance purposes
- Stay informed with a battery-powered or hand-crank radio

During a Hurricane

- Stay indoors and away from windows
- Do not use electrical equipment and appliances
- Listen to weather updates and emergency instructions
- If you are in an evacuation zone, leave immediately when advised

After a Hurricane

- Stay tuned to local news for updates and instructions
- Return home only when authorities say it is safe
- Stay away from downed power lines and floodwater
- Document property damage with photos
- Contact your insurance company to file a claim

What is a Hurricane? -The National Weather Service defines a hurricane as “an intense tropical weather system with well-defined circulation and sustained winds of 74 mph (64 knots) or higher.” Hurricanes are powerful storms that originate over warm ocean waters and can cause significant damage with their high winds, heavy rains, and storm surges.

Hurricane Watch- A hurricane watch is issued when there is a possibility that a region could experience hurricane conditions within 48 hours. This means that the storm is not yet guaranteed to hit the area, but there is a potential threat. Residents in the watch area should take preliminary precautions, stay informed with updates, and be prepared to take action if the watch is upgraded to a warning.

Hurricane Warning- A hurricane warning is more severe and indicates that sustained winds of at least 74 mph are expected within 36 hours. This means that hurricane conditions are imminent or highly likely. Residents in the warning area should complete all necessary preparations to protect life and property and adhere to any evacuation orders or safety instructions issued by local authorities.

Understanding the differences between a hurricane watch and a hurricane warning is crucial for effective preparation and response to these powerful natural disasters. Always stay informed through reliable weather sources and be prepared to take immediate action when necessary.

Pickleball Rules

The use of the court is for Orange Harbor residents and their guests only. Any player under 14 years of age must be accompanied by an adult.

Use of the courts is at the players' own risk. Do not use during hazardous weather or environmental conditions. Proper footwear required. Tennis/court shoes with non-marking soles must be worn.

No alcohol, vaping, or tobacco use allowed in courts.

Rotational play is expected when players are waiting. The losing team should submit to allow waiting team play time. Each winning player should only play two consecutive games.

Glass containers are not allowed. Please dispose of trash properly. Trash, debris, refuse is not to be left on courts.

No pets are allowed in courts.

No bicycles, skateboards, rollerblades, etc. are allowed on courts.

Damaged or unsafe court conditions must be reported.

Staying Fit During the Warmer Months in Florida

Florida's sunny climate and high temperatures can make staying active challenging during the warmer months. However, with a thoughtful approach, you can maintain your fitness routine while staying safe and comfortable.

First, consider exercising early in the morning or later in the evening when temperatures are cooler and humidity is lower. Hydration is also crucial—always carry water with you and take frequent sips, even if you don't feel thirsty.

Take advantage of Florida's natural beauty by swimming in pools or at the beach. Water exercises are gentle on the joints and provide a refreshing way to work out in the heat. Listen to your body, and rest in shaded areas if you start to feel overheated. With these tips, you can enjoy an active, healthy lifestyle throughout Florida's warm months.

Stingray Shuffle

Ft Myers Beach is part of Florida's Gulf Coast, where stingrays are commonly found in shallow waters, particularly during the warmer months of April through October. The combination of calm, warm waters and sandy bottoms makes the area an ideal habitat for these creatures. For visitors, this means a higher likelihood of encountering stingrays during peak beach season.

While stingray injuries are rarely life-threatening, they can result in intense pain, swelling, and, in severe cases, infection. Medical attention may be required to treat the wound and remove any embedded tail barb fragments. Employing the stingray shuffle is a simple yet vital precaution to prevent such incidents.

The stingray shuffle is an easy, preventive technique designed to reduce the risk of stepping on stingrays hidden beneath the sand. Stingrays often bury themselves in the shallow coastal waters to rest or avoid predators, making them nearly invisible to swimmers and waders. If startled by a sudden step, stingrays may defend themselves by whipping their venomous tail barb, potentially causing painful injuries.

The shuffle involves dragging your feet lightly through the sand as you walk in the water instead of lifting them with each step. This creates vibrations in the sand that alert stingrays to your presence, encouraging them to move away calmly rather than react defensively. It's an effortless and effective way to coexist with these marine animals.

- Keep your feet on the sand: Instead of lifting your feet, slide them forward smoothly, letting your toes stay in contact with the seabed.
- Create vibrations: The subtle movement of sand and water will alert stingrays to your presence without startling them.
- Stay vigilant: Observe the water's surface for signs of marine life and avoid areas where stingrays might congregate.
- Educate others: Share the stingray shuffle tip with friends and family to ensure everyone enjoys a safe beach experience.

Wear water shoes when possible!

Report to FWC: If you encounter injured or orphaned wildlife, contact the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) at 866-392-4286 (Alligators) 888-404-3922 (Other Wildlife)

Visit Wildlife Hospitals: The Paul & Veronica H. Gross Wildlife Center at (941) 484-9657 FROM 8 AM-6 PM

FOR AFTER-HOURS WILDLIFE EMERGENCY RESCUE ONLY: (941) 416-4967. They are

dedicated to rehabilitating injured wildlife. They provide medical care and support for their recovery.

Follow Safety Guidelines: Always wear protective gear when handling injured wildlife and follow the guidelines provided by wildlife organizations to ensure the safety of both you and the animals.



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Amenities Use Restriction – Amenities in the community are available to residents and guests who are currently living in Orange Harbor Mobile Home and RV Resort. Homeowners who rent out their property are not permitted to use the community facilities during the period their home is rented. Homeowners may still access their property for necessary purposes but should refrain from using any common areas or amenities while tenants occupy their home.

Pet Policies and Procedures



*Reminder- pet owners to observe the park rules regarding dogs, as failure to comply will result in a violation letter!

- Pick up and dispose of dog waste in YOUR trash or in the dog waste receptacles at the dog park.
- Always keep your dog on a leash and walk them on the road. **8' lead is the maximum allowed.**
- Do not allow your dog to walk, defecate, or urinate in other residents' yards or RV sites.
- Dogs must always be accompanied by an owner, when outside a residence or RV.
- You must keep your dog under control, especially around other dogs and pedestrians.
- Under the noise ordinance, excessive barking is considered a nuisance to other residents, inside or outside a residence.
- ALL PETS must be registered in the office. 8. Please keep cats on leash and do not let them out of your home unsupervised.

Don't forget to send in your dog and/or cat vaccinations to the office.

Wake Zones

The Orange River is an "Idle" zone river all season long. "Idle Speed, No Wake" Zone: A designated area where vessels must be operated at a speed no greater than that which is necessary to maintain steerage and headway. The vessel should not produce a wake at this speed.

The Caloosahatchee River has a "slow wake" from November 15 to March 31. Slow-No Wake

means operating a boat at the slowest speed necessary to maintain steerage and reduces or eliminates waves that appear as white water behind the boat in the same location frequently.

Resume normal operating speed from April 1- November 14.

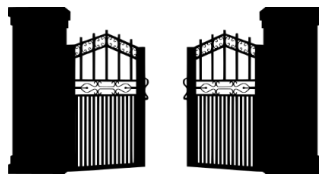

HOW TO LOCK A GOLF CART: SECURITY IDEAS

Golf cart security is important as long as there are thieves willing to jack your cart. It's really not that difficult for a thief to steal your golf cart and get away with it. Think about it. There's no breaking-in involved. A quick hot wire will get it started and next thing you know your cart is on eBay about to be sold to the highest bidder. Unless your cart really stands out in a crowd, it is unlikely that any witnesses will be able to pick it out of a line-up. Here are some simple and inexpensive ways to make your golf cart more secure.

- Install a unique key switch.
- Install a pedal lock.
- Install a steering wheel club.
- Install a wheel lock boot.
- Lock and chain.
- Park it close to your door and put your vehicle behind it.



New Orange Harbor Entry & Gate Procedure

There are three entry lanes: right for RV staging (get code, then shift left), center for residents/staff with electronic stickers (automatic gate opens), and left for all other vehicles (use keypad to call resident for entry).

- The new gate system was activated on September 15, 2025. Only registered residents can get stickers; all sublease tenants must be vetted by the office.
- Each gate set includes Lift and Swing Gates. Swing Gates are open 6:00 a.m.–7:00 p.m.; after hours, both gates require keypad or sticker access. Lift Gates open individually for authorized vehicles and all exiting traffic.
- Residents are called from 727-627-0781 at the keypad for gate opening. Surveillance cameras monitor entries/exits.
- Emergency vehicles, Amazon, and U.S. Mail use dedicated entry systems. Vendors and delivery companies may have special codes; other services must use the keypad.
- During emergencies, gates open automatically. Temporary codes for guests/contractors are available from the office and must be managed by residents.
- Residents can buy a second sticker for \$14.00 for a second vehicle. Tailgating is prohibited and enforced by sensors and cameras; violators are liable for damages.

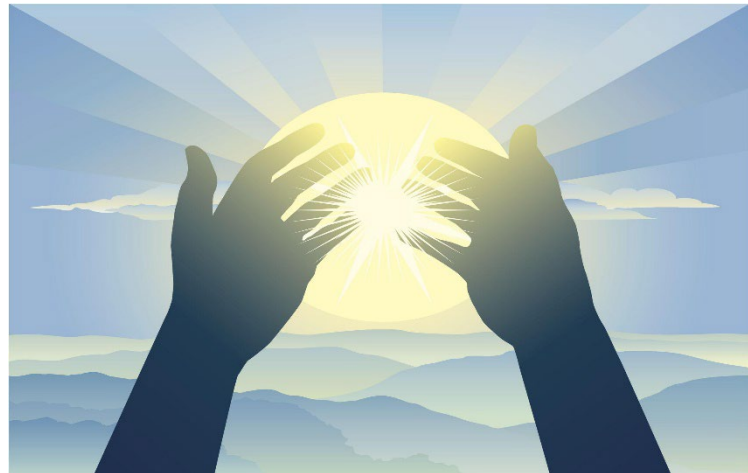
