Have You Read Your Rules & Regulations Lately?

This is a reminder that the Rules and Regulations are in effect and being enforced. All residents and their guests are expected to know and abide by these rules. New Rules and Regulations were voted on and adopted by the Board of Directors on May 27, 2022. You can access the Rules and Regulations by going to our website at Orangeharbormhc.com, click on the documents tab, click on community rules, and click on the pdf file.

The Manufactured home continued...

7. Watering of lawns is the responsibility of residents. Residents should abide by the watering guideline and restrictions imposed by the governmental agency having jurisdiction over the community. Sprinklers should be located so no excess water runs down the street.

8. Residents may mow their own lawn using their equipment. Grass, shrubs, clippings, palm fronds and tree limbs should be disposed of according to the current trash pickup schedules. See Section XV Refuse.

9. Trimming of mangroves must be in accordance with the Mangrove trimming and Preservation Act implemented by the Florida Dept. of Environmental Protection.

10. Laundry and bathing suits shall not be hung on any open carport or patio, but only on an umbrella type clothes drying device or folding rack placed at the rear of the manufactured home. The device shall be removed when not in use. In the interest of maintaining openness for all residents, no perimeter fences will be permitted.

11. Decorative dividers, lattice work or trellis may be permitted, but must have written approval from management before installation.

12. Any permanent changes to the home site must be submitted in writing to management and approved by management prior to the commencement of work.

13. UTILITIES a. Each homeowner is responsible for the payment of all electric, propane, telephone, cable, fiber optic TV service and other utility service charges associated with the provisions of such services to their associated lot. The homeowner's charges for these services are not included in the tenant fee or Maintenance Fee. The Co-op is responsible for electric and telephone lines to the boundary of the lot and for the meter boxes. The homeowner is responsible for the electrical lines from the meter boxes of the lot to the home.

b. No above ground propane gas tanks are permitted; however, above ground tanks installed prior to 1997 may remain. Small tanks used for outdoor grills are allowed.

c. All other services required by the resident are solely the resident's responsibility.

V. VACATING OF PREMISES

1. Thirty (30) days prior notice must be provided by any resident vacating their unit in the community, which includes the removal of the manufactured home from the lot.

2. Resident must furnish Co-Op with a true copy of the contract for removal of all of the above –ground improvements (the "Removal Contract"), which removal contract shall include, but not be limited to, the removal of the manufactured home, carport, storage shed(s), all attachments, skirting, anchors, and steps (the "improvements").

3. Resident shall post with Co-op a surety bond (the "Bond") furnished by the contractor of one hundred ten percent (110%) of the amount of the removal contract, which Bond shall act as security to ensure the removal of the "improvements" in a workmanlike fashion, leaving the lot in a broom-clean condition.

4. Resident shall have five (5) days from the date of the commencement of the removal of the "improvements" to complete the removal and grade the affected area of the unit, or Co-op may use the proceeds of the Bond to complete said removal.

5. Neither the resident nor the contractor shall be entitled to any refund of any unused portion of the Bond if the contractor fails to complete the removal of the Improvements in accordance with the terms and conditions of this paragraph.









From beach days to manatee sightings to museums that sneak in a little learning (without anyone noticing), SWFL makes it easy to keep the grandkids smiling while the grown-ups enjoy the sunshine too.

Sun and Surf

Beach time is a must! Fort Myers Beach offers miles of soft sand and gentle waves ideal for building sandcastles with your grandchildren, dipping toes in the water, or just watching the sunset together. Shell collecting is a perennial family favorite too.

*Thursday March 5th and Friday March 6th, 9am-5pm and Saturday March 7th from 9am-4pm consider going to the Community house on Sanibel Island for the 89th Sanibel Shell Show and Festival. There are judged scientific and artistic divisions, shell crafting demos, specimens and craft shell sales, dozens of vendors, live mollusk tanks and shell identification from the Shell Museum. There is a kids’ area with activities, raffles, and silent auctions, food trucks and much more!

Kayaking & Paddleboarding

For active families, guided kayaking or stand-up paddleboarding excursions on the calm backwaters offer serenity and wildlife sightings-often including dolphins and sea birds.

*Try the Great Calusa Blueway Paddling Trail. The trail stretches nearly 200 miles in the pristine coastal waters and inland tributaries in the Fort Myers area. It has been developed by Lee County Parks and Recreation and funded with tourist development tax dollars specifically dedicated to beach and shoreline enhancement projects. The best part is it starts right here in our own backyard on the Orange River! Go to visitfortmyers.com to download the trail map.

Interactive Museums for Curious Minds

*IMAG History & Science Center-Hands-on science exhibits, marine touch tanks, and historical displays make this a hit with kids and adults alike.

*Calusa Nature Center & Planetarium-Explore nature trails, view wildlife up close, and enjoy planetarium shows under the stars (indoors).

Take a leisurely stroll to soak up local history, art, and architecture. You might also enjoy visiting the Edison & Ford Winter Estates-historic homes and gardens where Thomas Edison and Henry Ford spent winters tinkering and exploring.


March is in the Air at Orange Harbor

During peak season at Orange Harbor, managing guest parking can prove challenging due to the increased volume of visitors and limited space. To ensure smooth coordination, residents hosting overnight guests are encouraged to utilize designated temporary guest parking areas within the community. It is important to secure a parking permit by visiting the office beforehand. Adhering to this procedure helps maintain order and prevents inconveniences such as vehicles blocking driveways, occupying streets, or using vacant lots unauthorizedly.

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Featured Amenities Guide

Welcome to our community! We take pride in offering a variety of amenities to make your visit both relaxing and memorable. Please review the following guide to familiarize yourself with our facilities, their locations, and the rules that help keep them enjoyable for everyone.

Swimming Pool-Enjoy a refreshing swim from sunrise to sunset. All guests aged 14 and under must be accompanied by an adult. For your safety, please do not remove the rope separating the deep and shallow ends of the pool. If you do move it, be sure to replace it—failure to do so may result in a fine.

Library-Our clubhouse library is well-stocked with books, puzzles, and games for all ages. When you're done enjoying them, please return items to their proper place.

Billiards-Test your skills on our new billiards table in the clubhouse. Please follow posted rules to ensure everyone can enjoy the game.

Ice Machine-The ice cube machine is located in the clubhouse. Use the provided scoop, take no more than three scoops at a time, and remember to close the lid after use.

Bocce Ball & Shuffleboard-Bocce ball courts are situated next to the clubhouse parking lot, with equipment readily available nearby. Shuffleboard equipment is in the shed beside the court.

Storage and Boat Slips-We offer 41 storage spaces and 17 boat slips, all rented annually on a first-come, first-served basis. For pricing or availability, contact the office directly.

Clubhouse-Located at the heart of our community, the clubhouse is the venue for many of our social activities. It is also available to rent for special occasions. For reservations, please contact Denise Miller at 603-493-1719.

Garbage Disposal and Plant Cuttings-A dumpster and a trailer for plant cuttings are available 24/7. Please do not dispose of large items in the trash compactor—these must have a paid sticker from the office. Sort your waste into the appropriate containers.

Boat Ramps-We have two boat ramps: one near the office and another next to Gypsy Hall by the RV section. Be mindful not to park trucks or trailers where they may be towed during boat launching.

Ping Pong-The table is located in the clubhouse with all of equipment needed for play.

Horseshoe Pits-Horseshoe courts are located near the pavilion and the pool for your enjoyment.

Fishing Pier & Fish Cleaning Station-The fishing pier, found on the northwest side of the park, is open to all residents. Please follow all fishing regulations and dispose of used fishing lines in the designated bin. There's also a fish cleaning station in the RV park, complete with a cutting surface and running water. Please dispose of fish waste.

Dog Park & Wash Station-A fenced-in dog park is open 24 hours daily for your pets. Dog waste bags and bins are available—remember to clean up after your pet. Wash station located in between the shuffleboard and laundrymat.

Pavilions-There are two pavilions—one near the pool and one in the RV section. Both are available to rent for special occasions. To reserve, please contact Denise Miller at 603-493-1719.

Pickleball Court-Located next to the office, the pickleball court operates under rules posted at the entrance. Please note: lights out at 11 p.m.

Laundry Room-Our laundry room is open daily from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. Help us keep it clean by closing the door at all times and reporting any maintenance issues to management immediately. If you discover a problem with a machine, kindly write down the issue and notify the office, as well as place a note on the affected machine.

Restrooms and Showers-There are restrooms and showers located in the clubhouse. They are also available in the RV section. You can find a restroom near the shuffleboard courts and restrooms located in the back of the office with an access door on the outside of the building.

Memorial Garden—All are welcome to enjoy the beauty and tranquility of our memorial butterfly garden, thoughtfully designed as a peaceful refuge for quiet reflection. Whether you seek a serene moment alone or wish to admire the fluttering visitors among the blooms, this garden provides a gentle space amid the vibrancy of our community.

Community Vegetable Garden—For residents wishing to cultivate their own fresh produce, the community vegetable garden is open to all paid participants. Plots may be reserved through the garden club on a seasonal basis.

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10 Things You Should Never Put Down the Drain:

To avoid costly plumbing repairs and environmental damage, never pour fats, grease, coffee grounds,

medication, paint, harsh chemicals, produce stickers, fibrous vegetables, starchy foods (rice/pasta), eggshells, or hygiene products (wipes/floss) down the drain. These items cause severe blockages, pipe corrosion, or pollute water systems.

Quick checklist of items to not put down your drain:

1. **Fats, Oils, and Grease (FOG):** Bacon fat, cooking oil, and butter solidify inside pipes, causing major blockages.
2. **Coffee Grounds:** They do not dissolve and accumulate, creating stubborn clogs.
3. **Eggshells:** The sharp, granular pieces stick to grease, forming sludges that blocks pipes.
4. **Starchy Foods (Rice, Pasta, Flour):** These expand with water and turn into a paste, restricting water flow.
5. **Produce Stickers:** These small stickers rarely disintegrate, often getting stuck in pipe walls or caught in filters.
6. **Fibrous Vegetables/Food Scraps:** Celery, corn husks, and potato peels can tangle around disposal blades.
7. **Medications:** Pills and liquids pass through treatment plants into water sources, harming the environment.
8. **Paint and Solvents:** Hazardous chemicals can corrode pipes and damage plumbing.
9. **Flushable/Baby Wipes:** Despite the name, they do not dissolve, creating massive sewer blockages.
10. **Hair and Dental Floss:** These items do not degrade, catching other debris to create large, tangled clogs.

We Recycle on Fridays

Please place your handle towards your house and the open side toward the street for proper pickup!



Recycle Smart-5 For the Cart:

Paper-junk mail, newsprint, magazines, copy paper, phone books, etc. **DO NOT** put in used paper towels, tissues, napkins.

Metal cans-aluminum or steel (tin) cans. No need to remove labels or crush cans.

Cardboard-Any kind of box unless it held a liquid (such as those to hold milk, juice, wine, and broth). Pizza box lids can be recycled, the bottoms can be recycled if they do not have any food residue on them.

Plastic Containers-Look for the number 1-7 within the recycle triangles on the bottom of the container (no Styrofoam, no plastic bags) Lids can be either on or off.

Glass-green, brown, and clear bottles and jars.

Trash Removal and Yard Waste Schedule:

Are you prepared for brush pick-up? **Wednesday** is your day to embrace your inner gardener and tie up those yard clippings into tidy bundles—**each no longer than 3 feet**. Let's keep those sprawling shrub beasts at bay! **A quick tip: keep your green piles away from the mailbox to avoid any accidental tractor showdowns.** Together, we can keep our streets neat and our tractors happy!

Tuesdays & Fridays: Garbage pick-up! Rise and shine, it's garbage time! Get those bags out early to keep the critters away. Remember, no animal buffets!


Membership is open to all residents of the park. You don't need to own a boat, just have an interest in being involved in our community and support our outreach efforts.





Meet Your Neighbors Continued... Meet Ron and Sue Steiner.

Ron and Sue first arrived at Orange Harbor with their motor home on January 8, 2010. My journal said “really nice place

– people were very welcoming and friendly. Set up at 1348 Fourth St. in the RV section.” Within the first half hour we were here, neighbors on both sides of us welcomed us and brought over the newsletter. They told us there was coffee and donuts at the clubhouse the next day (Saturday). We went to the clubhouse around 9 in the morning, expecting a few people to be having coffee and donuts. Little did we know the clubhouse would be full of people. We learned in a hurry that “Orange Harbor time” really meant at least 15 minutes before the posted time. We saw people in line getting donuts, so we got in line. But we were quickly told that we needed to sit at a table, and that when our card was called, we would go in line for donuts. Another Orange Harbor lesson quickly learned.

We stayed at Orange Harbor in January and February and then moved down to Red Coconut RV Park on Fort Myers Beach for March. In 2012, we drove down with a truck and trailer. We purchased a fifth wheel from someone in Zolfo Springs. Eventually, we were on the RV committee at Orange Harbor. In March 2014, the head of the committee spoke with Ron about being the RV host for next year. That fall we arrived at Orange Harbor in early October. Ron started his RV host job on October 14, 2014. Since then, his job has gone from the middle of October until the middle of April. In January 2015, Sue introduced Strong Senior Strong Bones to Orange Harbor. She has been doing it ever since, except for a few years after Hurricane Ian. In March 2016, we purchased 1281 Third St. In January 2018, we remodeled our bathrooms. When the plumber came on January 25, 2018, he did not connect everything correctly. Our place got flooded. We ended up having to replace all the flooring, cabinets, and cupboards. It took until the end of March to get that all replaced. While our place has never had water damage from any hurricane, we can relate to those of you who have, though ours wasn't from river mud.

Then there was Irma (2017), Covid (2020), Ian (2022), Milton (2024), and Helene (2024). We can all relate to what it has taken to bring Orange Harbor back to those earlier days, and better than before.

Ron is in his 12th year as RV Host, a job he continues to enjoy. He power-washes the empty sites for those coming in during the season, power-washes the white fences when they start to turn green, checks that the power is on in the sites, and helps park RVs as they come in. Besides his daily mail duty, he is out visiting with folks, solving problems, and answering their questions. Since 2014, he has gone up to the clubhouse and laundromat at 10 pm each evening to lock the facilities. This year, with the doors on timers, he is finally relieved of that responsibility. He should have written a book on all the unusual problems that have occurred over the years. (The snake in someone's RV, the beehive in another RV, etc.)

Sue continues to be busy with power walking class, Strong Seniors Strong Bones, and Hobbies and Crafts. She also works online and teaches Algebra and Geometry to students throughout WI.

Ron was a production engineer at Tecumseh Engines back in WI. Sue was a classroom teacher (math and computer science) and a technology coordinator for her school district. She helped start the district's online school in 2002, which is now a statewide program. Their daughter is a manager of the local utility company in Menasha, where Ron and Sue live. Every time we pay our utility bill, we pay her salary. Their son-in-law is the safety director of Green Bay Packaging. Their grandson is a manufacturing engineer at a major company in the area, and their granddaughter teaches 5th grade at a local middle school.

Ron and Sue go back to WI in the spring to spend time with family. Ron enjoys hunting, boating, and fishing. They live on Lake Winnebago; the largest lake located entirely within WI. Sue plays pickleball, golfs, and rides her waverunner. They both enjoy riding their e-bikes, especially on trails in northern WI.

Pet Policies and Procedures

Wake Zones

The Orange River is an "Idle" zone river all season long. "Idle Speed, No Wake" Zone: A designated area where vessels must be operated at a speed no greater than that which is necessary to maintain steerage and headway. The vessel should not produce a wake at this speed.

The Caloosahatchee River has a "slow wake" from November 15 to March 31. Slow-No Wake means operating a boat at the slowest speed necessary to maintain steerage and reduces or eliminates waves that appear as white water behind the boat in the same location frequently. Resume normal operating speed from April 1- November 14.



Winter Water Conservation Tips

- Turn off the tap while brushing your teeth or shaving. Sweep driveways instead of hosing them down. Install low-flow showerheads and toilets for extra savings.



New Orange Harbor Entry & Gate Procedure

There are three entry lanes: right for RV staging (get code, then shift left), center for residents/staff with electronic stickers (automatic gate opens), and left for all other vehicles (use keypad to call resident for entry).

- The new gate system was activated on September 15, 2025. Only registered residents can get stickers; all sublease tenants must be vetted by the office.
- Each gate set includes Lift and Swing Gates. Swing Gates are open 6:00 a.m.–7:00 p.m.; after hours, both gates require keypad or sticker access. Lift Gates open individually for authorized vehicles and all exiting traffic.
- Residents are called from 727-627-0781 at the keypad for gate opening. Surveillance cameras monitor entries/exits.
- Emergency vehicles, Amazon, and U.S. Mail use dedicated entry systems. Vendors and delivery companies may have special codes; other services must use the keypad.
- During emergencies, gates open automatically. Temporary codes for guests/contractors are available from the office and must be managed by residents.
- Residents can buy a second sticker for \$14.00 for a second vehicle. Tailgating is prohibited and enforced by sensors and cameras; violators are liable for damages.


